



Chapel Street Primary School Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure: Plans for the Academic Year 2014/15

Funding for this academic year will be approximately £314,000. Funding is currently based on £1,300 per child eligible for Free School Meals and £1,900 for children in care.

Key Objectives for 2014 -15

Wellbeing:

- to address the personal, social and emotional needs of pupils through interventions to allow learning to take place;
- through effective use of strategies/interventions, pupils will be settled in lessons therefore improving their attainment;
- review, monitor, evaluate and analyse interventions and their impact.

Literacy:

- deploy an Assistant Headteacher and Teacher to coordinate and improve phonics learning across KS1 and lower KS2;
- to provide effective reading interventions. Upskilling and training Teachers and Teaching Assistants in these interventions;
- introduce effective interventions for all pupils to raise standards in writing in line with the revised national curriculum;
- pupils' reading levels and test scores will show progress towards attaining national curriculum expectations;
- adjust guided reading groups to ensure pupils are correctly grouped. Order additional resources. Establish timetable for interventions;
- to use data and pupil achievement meetings to identify target groups and individuals.

Numeracy:

- provide effective numeracy interventions (Every Child Counts);
- pupils will show progress in Maths attainment to close in on the national curriculum expectations;
- continue target group work to support appropriate pace of progress;

- employ a Teacher dedicated to teach Maths across KS2.

Engagement:

- to further develop independence and participation in lessons through the use of innovative technology and effective differentiation;
- to further develop the curriculum to improve motivation and engagement;
- enhance the curriculum by providing opportunities for wider learning experiences, such as visits out of school.

Overall:

- increase pupil/teacher ratio, particularly in key year groups to support Pupil Premium children;
- employ 2 Teaching Assistants to work with Pupil Premium children to improve attainment in Literacy and Numeracy.
